

Now, go to Dough Disco on YouTube Happy dancing!</p> 	<p><u>PLAYDOUGH RECIPE</u></p> <p><u>Ingredients</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 1 cup of flour ● ¼ cup of salt ● 1 teaspoon of vegetable oil ● Food colouring (optional) <p><u>How to make</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Add the flour to a bowl. 2. Mix together the food colouring and water in a separate bowl. 3. Mix the two bowls together add more flour if it gets sticky. 4. Add the vegetable oil at the end. 5. Store in an airtight container.
<p><u>MATHS</u></p> <p>Activity 1 – Size Talk about the different dogs in the story Hairy McClary. Some are big, some medium and some are small. Go on a hunt around the house or garden for things that are big and small.</p> <p>Activity 2 – Prepositions Look out of your window, encourage the use of positional language. “There is a bird on the fence”. “The car is in front of the garage”. “The dog is under the tree.” Can you crawl under and over and through something?</p>	<p><u>Hairy Maclary</u></p>  <p>These activities support the skills your child would be working towards.
