What have we been doing this week?

Little pips (9month—2 year room)

The nursery rhyme of the week was "row, row, row your boat" so we have been colouring boat pictures and making marks with pens. We have had lots of fun in the water tray with big red and blue boats. We have also been making lovely cards for Father's day and sending home our sunflowers. We went for a walk to the quay to see if we could see some duck and ducklings and had our snack on the quay looking at the buses and cars going across the bridge. That was fun. Appleblossoms (2-3 year room)

This week we have been looking at our new topic, 'Pirates'. The children have enjoyed looking at pictures of different pirates and having a go at creating their own pirate hats using tissue paper, sequins and feathers. We have enjoyed getting dressed up into costumes before walking the plank and digging for treasure in the sand. This have opened up conversations about what pirates say, do and look like. The children have loved dancing along to our dance of the week 'over the deep blue sea'. Next week we will continue looking at pirates and their ships.

Appletree Preschool (3-4 year room)

This week our new story is 'Sharing a Shell'. We have made cinnamon swirls to make a spiral pattern just like the hermit crab. We have started making our own shells decorating with tissue paper and using the water spray to make the colours bleed into the shells. We have been making patterns in our sparkly sand using our fingers. Our raspberry bushes are starting to produce some yummy golden and normal coloured raspberries. We have picked washed and tasted our berries, yum!

Phonics

We are still listening for our initial sounds in words and identifying the 'odd one out' e.g. box, bottle, shell.

Maths

We have been using our '10 little fish' song to find one more and one less.

"The cinnamon rolls were shaped like a spiral."

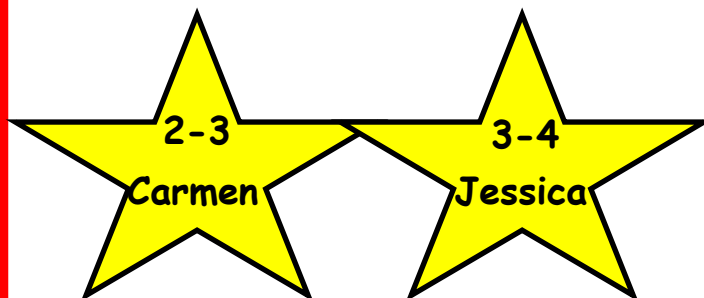
